



Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Descent Form

Introduction

YMAC is often asked to provide Confirmation of Aboriginality; usually this evidence will consist of a statutory declaration completed by the applicant and a document executed by an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander organisation confirming that the applicant is recognised by his or her community as an Aboriginal person or Torres Strait Islander. However, applicants may be required to provide additional evidence if the usual evidence is not considered sufficient.

The following guidelines are intended to assist applicants applying for benefits and confirming organisations to complete this form:

Guidelines for Applicants / Guidelines for Recognising Organisations

Each applicant must complete a statutory declaration, as the statutory declaration requires the applicant to state that he or she is of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent, some, or all the applicants ancestors must be Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people. The declaration also requires the applicant to state that he or she identifies as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person and that he or she is recognised by his or her community as a person who is of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent.

Applicants should complete the applicants declaration before forwarding the document to an organisation for completion of the confirmation section.

Section 136 of the Criminal Code Act 1995 makes it an offence punishable by imprisonment for 12 months for a person to make a statement to the Commonwealth entity in a document knowing that statement to be false or misleading.

Such confirmation must be approved by a resolution at a formal meeting of the YMAC Board of Directors and the record of such resolution is to be sealed with the Common Seal of the organisation and signed by the authorised signatories.
