Announcement of New Name

Yamatji Marlpa Barna Baba Maaja Aboriginal Corporation is proud to announce that our members have voted to change our Corporation's name to, **Yamatji Marlpa Aboriginal Corporation (YMAC)**.

This decision was voted on by Yamatji and Pilbara members at a special general meeting on Saturday, 8 November 2008 at Cardabia Station, Coral Bay. Our new name reflects the equal standing and cultural diversity of both regions and the Traditional Owners we represent; those being '*Yamatji*', the Aboriginal people of the Murchison, Gascoyne and Midwest; and '*Marlpa*', used by Traditional Owners to denote the Aboriginal people of the Pilbara.

Roy Bellotti and Doris Eaton,
Co-Chairpersons of YMAC
said the change reflects both
regions and symbolised the
way both cultural sides respect
each other in their work
together.

As the Native Title
Representative Body for the
Pilbara, Murchison, Gascoyne
and Midwest regions of WA,
YMAC represents over 25
different native title groups - all
with their own culture,
language and traditions.
